As talkers, readers and writers we will;

*Join in with world book day and dress up as a character from a story and bring in our favourite book or talk about our favourite Nursery story read since September.

*We will talk about why our Mum's are special to us and what they do for us, we will discuss how we have changed from being babies to now. Any baby photo's would be appreciated!

*We will listen to the retelling of the Easter story and take part in our whole school Easter assembly.

*Continue to practise writing our names in nursery, reading and writing simple sentences in reception.

As young mathematicians we will;

- *Easter eggs hunts positional language, how many, more/fewer, one more. Begin to understand if something is taken away the amount gets smaller -use easter objects to solve problems.
- *Ordering numbers and sequencing events
- *Easter egg pattern matching game
- * making baby bottles up full, half full, nearly full, nearly empty, empty
- *Singing number rhymes e.g. 5 little Easter Eggs and acting them out. Discussing more and fewer.
- *counting out pancakes for Mr Wolf and finding one more.
- * sharing pancakes with our friends and discussing who has more and fewer pancakes in the pancake role play shop.

As friendly caring individuals we will;

*Discussing special people in our lives and what makes them special. looking at photographs of ourselves as babies and listening to others when they are talking about their mums. *Look after our environment and the seeds we plant, taking care of living things and knowing how to look after them. *Take turns and wear wellies when digging in the flower garden.



As happy healthy movers we will;

- * Engage in daily finger gym activities, e.g. using tweezers to sort the seeds, making a face with coins, etc.
- *Manipulate dough to create simple representations exercising our finger muscles (helping us to mark make)
- * use tools for digging and planting seeds in the garden during forest school.
- *Join in with wiggle and squiggle activities
- *Take part in ready set ride activities to enhance fine and gross motor skills.

As inquisitive investigators we will;

- Plant seeds from the sunflower head and watch what happens closely drawing images of what you can see, taking care of your own seed.
- Use the children's interests as a springboard to finding out about more spring animals. Research on the Internet using a child-friendly search engine.
- Experiment with coloured flowers in diff coloured dyes. Looking at how the plant sucks up the water.
- Plant vegetables in our vegetable patch and label them, also take care of our new smelling garden. Discuss any observations made.
- Discovering different sounds in the environment.

- *We will listen to Easter songs and rhymes, we will perform our favourite at the school Easter Assembly
- *We will make floating flowers art and use technology to take photographs of our work. Use different media's paints and colour mixing, oil pastels, pencils, chalks and even milk
- *Create patterned eggs using wax and water paint.
- *Create simple representations with e.g. dough, cut and stick, Mothers day and Easter cards etc.
